## Agriculture is Everywhere!

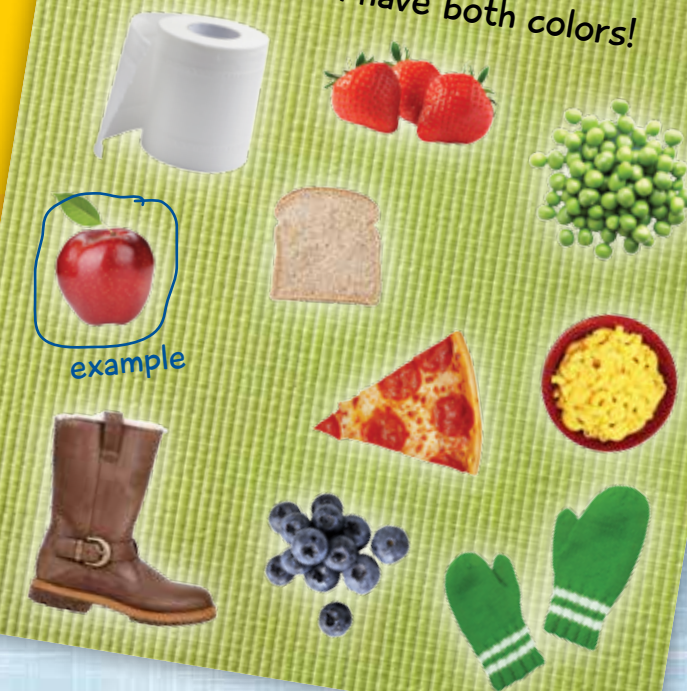
Look around: Agriculture is everywhere. Agriculture is workers making things grown on farms, like plants and animals, into things we use.
